Vice – President of the Court of Appeal for Specialized Cases

皆さまに自己紹介できることを光栄に思います。現在、私は特別事件（知的財産/国際通商部）の控訴裁判所副所長をつとめており知的財産と国際通商にかかわる事件を扱っています。現職に就く前は、同じ部で、当該分野の事件を取扱う裁判長の職をつとめたほか、最高裁で知的財産/国際通商部の調査判事として勤務したことがあり、さらに1年間、中央知的財産/国際通商特別裁判所の副裁判長をつとめました。

学歴は、タイで最も歴史がある私立のバンコク・クリスチャン大学から始め、同様に最も歴史があるチュラロンコン大学で学士（優等）を取得しました。司法試験に合格し、翌年、法曹資格を取得したのち、チュラロンコン大学で修士課程を卒業、私の学位論文はライセンス契約の法的観点—タイ法、日本法間の比較考察でした。

英国で修士、博士を取得するための奨学金を付与され、ロンドン大学（キングスカレッジ）から修士学位（知的財産）を取得し、リバプール大学から博士号を取得しました。学位論文は、「時限措置—TRIPs（知的所有権の貿易関連の側面に関する協定）がタイ法のもとでの救済手段に及ぼす影響の考察」でした。

私には、本セミナーに関連する経験があります。最初は、チュラロンコン大学の修士課程履修時、交換留学生に選ばれ、6か月間、東京の創価大学で論文研究に従事しました。その後、国連アジア極東犯罪防止研修所（UNAFET）主催の3か月間のワークショップに参加しました。さらに、知的財産研究所（IIP）の援助により、6か月間東京で、知的財産事件における日本の最高裁調査判事の役割と題する研究をおこないました。また、2017年12月はTRIPsと国家司法に関するシンポジウム、2018年9月は国際・開発研究大学院でのタイ国判事のための幹部研修プログラムに参加しています。

It is my pleasure to introduce myself to you. At present, I am the Vice President of the Court of Appeal for Specialized Cases (Intellectual Property and International Trade Division). I have dealt mostly with both Intellectual Property and International Trade cases. Before resuming this position, I worked in this Division as the Presiding Justice rendering the Judgements for such Intellectual Property and International Trade cases. I used to work as the Research Justice of the Intellectual Property and International Trade Division in the Supreme Court as well. Moreover, I was the Deputy Chief Justice of the Central Intellectual Property and International Trade Court for one year.

According to my educational background, I started my study at the Bangkok Christian College, the oldest private school in Thailand. I received my LL.B. (Hons.) from the Chulalongkorn University, also the oldest university in Thailand. I passed the examination and was called to the Bar in the following year. I was, then, graduated for LL.M. from the Chulalongkorn University. My thesis was Legal Aspects about Licensing Agreements: A Comparative Study between the Laws of Thailand and Japan.

I was granted a scholarship to do my LL.M. and Ph.D. in the United Kingdom. I finished my LL.M. (Intellectual Property) from the University of London (King's College) and pursued my Ph.D. from the University of Liverpool. My thesis was Provisional Measure: A Study of the Impact of TRIPs on Remedial Measures in Thai Laws.

I have had several related experiences concerning this Symposium. First, when I studied for LL.M. at the Chulalongkorn University, I was chosen as the exchange student to do my thesis at Soka University in Tokyo for six months. I have been, later, invited to participate in the workshop program of the United Nations Asia and Far East Institute (UNAFET) in Tokyo for three months. Again, I went to Tokyo for six months, sponsored by the Institute of Intellectual Property (IIP), to do my research called The Roles of the Research Judges of the Japanese Supreme Court in the Intellectual Property Cases. I, then, went to visit Geneva for the last two years consecutively. In December 2017, I attended the Symposium on TRIPs Agreement and the National Judiciary and, in September 2018, I was a participant in the program called Executive training for Judges from the Judiciary of Thailand at the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies.
