BACKGROUND OF ENFORCEMENT DIVISION, MDTCA

Established on 17 April 1972 under the Ministry of Trade and Industry (MTI) – to curb inflation On 27 October 1990, the Ministry was restructured to form two ministries namely the Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) and the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs (MDTCA).

ENFORCEMENT MECHANISM AND STATUTES RELATED.

Clean up shopping malls, reminders to landlord / premises' owner (1862 notices)

Arrest case, charge the accused in less than one month

Several Efforts To Protect Copyright And Trade Mark Remove contents, take down infringing websites – specific section/team to monitor online matters

Business compliant; combat software piracy; campaign by the Industry (BSA)

Cripple syndicates

Amendments of the Trade Mark Act 2019

Public awareness

Awareness to shopping mall: self regulatory campaign (year 2020) (110 Malls, 5,242 premises)



The powers related to enforcement of piracy and counterfeit goods are as follows :

- Power to enter premises, inspect and seize goods;
- Power of investigations, require of information;
- Power of arrest;
- Access to digitalized data;
- Power to forfeit seized goods;
- > Evidence of agent provocateur.

IPR OFFENCES FINES

Copyright Act 1987

- Makes for sale/hire, sells/offer for sale, distribute, possess, import, etc.
- Penalties :
- min. MYR2,000 (USD550) max MYR20,000 (USD5,508) per infringing copy and/or max. 5 years imprisonment

Trademarks Act 2019

- Under Section 102 of TMA, any person who imports into Malaysia for the purpose of trade or manufacture, sells or offers or exposes for sale, or has in his possession, custody or control for the purpose of trade or manufacture, any goods to which a registered Trademark is falsely applied under Section 100 of TDA 2019, will be liable to a fine.
- Penalties:
- Corporation max. MYR15,000 (USD4,131) for each goods;
- Individual MYR10,000 (USD2,754) for each goods and/or 3 years imprisonment

Trade Description Act 2011

Applies false trade description, supplies/offer to supply, expose, possess, custody or control goods with false description

Penalties:

Corporation max. MYR15,000 (USD4,131) for each goods; Individual MYR10,000 (USD2,754) for

each goods and/or 3 years imprisonment



COORDINATION WITH OTHER ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

Customs (KDRM) – border

Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC) – online piracy / counterfeit

Local Council – information on ownership of businesses Police (PDRM) - arrest case, intelligence sharing

Co-operation with IPR owners:

- intelligence sharing

Product training

Several steps taken by the government to combat piracy and counterfeit goods:

- Special Task Force Committee (co-operation with LEAs)
- Special Unit to tackle online piracy and counterfeit issues
- -Co-operation with brand owners (intelligence, operations, training)
- Action also taken under AMLATFPUAA 2001
